

Founded in 1987, Attila Glatz Concert Productions (AGCP) has been a leader in concert productions and promotions since the company's signature presentation of the "New Year's Salute to Vienna" began in Toronto's Roy Thompson Hall twenty years ago. Presently, it engages more than 700 most talented singers, dancers and conductors hand-picked from European cities. In 2014, more than 8 casts performed more than 20 concerts over the New Year in eight Canadian cities alone. The 2014 <u>PBS TV</u> Network's largest "Salute to Vienna" special concert, has been aired more than 800 times.

For all these and more, it is no wonder <u>co-founders Marion and Attila Glatz</u> are proud recipients of the "<u>Decoration of Merit in Gold</u>" awarded by the Austrian government.



Because of Attila, there is also a wonderful Hungarian connection, since the AGCP concerts always include marvelous rare opportunities for most talented Hungarian artists to perform in North America. Furthermore, AGCP presented performances like The Hungarian State Ensemble and Violin virtuoso, Maga Zoltan, while successively including favourite compositions of Ferenc Lehar and Imre Kalman.
